#### 2. About vACC Switzerland

VATSIM is divided into regions and divisions. The region of Europe is represented by VATEUD. All regions contain local «Virtual Area Control Centers (vACC). vACC Switzerland is a member of VATEUD. The local vACCs are responsible for training of pilots and controllers in their area.

We are using an online forum and TeamSpeak 3 server to keep in contact with each other. We also meet regularly in real life. Many great friendships started in our vACC.

#### 3. What do I need?

To start flying you will need the following things:

- Computer with internet connection
- Recommended Headset and microphone (for TeamSpeak and voice frequency)
- A supported flightsim (FSX2004, FSX, P3D, MSFS, X-Plane)
- Pilot client for Vatsim

The installation of the pilot clients is very simple. There are lots of instructions on the Vatsim website or on YouTube. We can assist you if you are experiencing issues with the installation.

#### 4. Training opportunities

At vACC Switzerland we are having a pilot training department. Our trainers can help you with your questions. Due to the low demand on training in our vACC we can only offer individual trainings on your request. We cannot provide training for official Vatsim ratings. We can help you getting started with Vatsim and certain questions around flying in general. If you are interested in an individual training you should create a lesson request on our website under TMSv2 or send an email to <a href="mailto:pilottd@vacc.ch">pilottd@vacc.ch</a>.

Vatsim completely renewed its rating system in 2020. Ratings are quite complex and offer quite a bit of knowledge. Ratings are not required to fly on Vatsim but they are an interesting challenge. The official Vatsim pilot ratings are inspired by real pilot licenses.

- **PO** Basic Vatsim Member -> Initial rating, directly after registration.
- P1 Private Pilot Licence (PPL)
- **P2** Instrument Rating (IR)
- P3 Commercial Multi Engine Licence (CMEL)
- **P4** Airline Transport Licence (ATPL)
